



DR. DONALD SWEETING

Dr. Donald W. Sweeting is a pastor and educator. He received his B.A. in history from Lawrence University. At Oxford University in England he read theology and studied church history, receiving a B.A. and M.A. degree. He later earned his Ph.D. in historical theology at Trinity International University.

For more than 20 years Sweeting served as a pastor, first as a church planter in northern Illinois, then coming to Colorado to serve as the senior pastor at Cherry Creek Presbyterian Church in Greenwood Village. While at Cherry Creek, Sweeting was an adjunct faculty member at Denver Seminary teaching church history. He joined the Board of Trustees at Colorado Christian University where he served as the chairman of the Academic Affairs Committee under President Bill Armstrong.

In 2010, Sweeting was called to become the president of Reformed Theological Seminary in Orlando, Florida. There he was also named the James Woodrow Hassel Professor of Church History. In 2016, Sweeting was named the president of Colorado Christian University.

Sweeting speaks and preaches around the country and has published numerous articles for well-known magazines and scholarly journals. He also co-authored two books and is working on several others.

He and his wife, Christina, (who teaches New Testament Greek at CCU) have three sons and a daughter.



LEE STROBEL

Atheist-turned-Christian Lee Strobel, the former award-winning legal editor of the *Chicago Tribune*, is a *New York Times* best-selling author of more than 40 books and curricula that have sold 14 million copies in total. He has been described in the *Washington Post* as "one of the evangelical community's most popular apologists."

Strobel was educated at the University of Missouri (Bachelor of Journalism) and Yale Law School (Master of Studies in Law). He was a journalist for 14 years at the *Chicago Tribune* and other newspapers, winning Illinois' highest honor for public service journalism from United Press International. He also led a team that won UPI's top award for investigative reporting in Illinois.


After probing the evidence for Jesus for nearly two years, Strobel became a Christian in 1981. He subsequently became a teaching pastor at three of America's largest churches and hosted the national network TV program, "Faith Under Fire." In addition, he taught First Amendment law at Roosevelt University and was professor of Christian thought at Houston Baptist University.

In 2017, Strobel's spiritual journey was depicted in an award-winning motion picture, "The Case for Christ," which was shown in theaters across America and around the world. The movie is still on Netflix. Strobel won national awards for his books *The Case for Christ, The Case for Faith, The Case for a Creator,* and *The Case for Grace*. His latest book is *The Case for Miracles*.

Currently, Strobel is founding director of the Lee Strobel Center for Evangelism and Applied Apologetics at Colorado Christian University. He and his wife, Leslie, have been married for 47 years. Their daughter, Alison, is a novelist, and their son, Kyle, is a professor of spiritual theology at the Talbot School of Theology at Biola University.

GARY MCQUINN

Gary McQuinn earned his B.A. in biblical languages from Northland International University and his M.A. in biblical theology and exegesis from Wheaton College. From 2010 to 2014, McQuinn helped plant and pastor The Crossing Church in Fort Collins and launched Porterbrook Colorado, part of a theological training network that equips leaders of gospel-centered missional communities. In 2014, McQuinn and his family came to Denver to join Park Church where he serves as the lead pastor. He also serves as the central Colorado area leader for Acts 29.
