Dr. Donald W. Sweeting is a pastor-educator. He received his B.A. in history from Lawrence University. At Oxford University in England he read theology and studied church history, receiving a B.A. and M.A. degree. He later earned his Ph.D. in historical theology at Trinity International University.

For over 20 years Don served as a pastor, first as a church planter in northern Illinois, then coming to Colorado to serve as the senior pastor at Cherry Creek Presbyterian Church in Greenwood, Village.

While at Cherry Creek, Don was an adjunct faculty member at Denver Seminary teaching church history. He joined the Board of Trustees at Colorado Christian University where he served as the chairman of the Academic Affairs Committee under President Bill Armstrong.

In 2010 Don was called to become the president of Reformed Theological Seminary in Orlando, Florida. There he was also named the James Woodrow Hassel Professor of Church History. In 2016, Don was named the president of Colorado Christian University.

He and his wife, Christina, (who teaches New Testament Greek at CCU) have three sons and a daughter.

Dr. Megan DeVore is associate professor of Church History and Early Christian Studies in CCU's undergraduate School of Theology. She has a Ph.D. in Theology from University of Wales, a M.A. in Classics from University of Colorado, studied Church History and Philosophy at Oxford University, and earned her B.A. at Colorado Christian University. Her research focuses on historic Christian theology and practice, and her scholarship includes related fields such as ancient history, art and architecture, and philosophy. She takes seriously the Scriptural command to "Remember the days of old, consider the years of every generation," (Deuteronomy 32:7), and her classes, writing, and understanding of flourishing and vocation reflect this conviction.

Megan is a spiritual mentor both on the CCU campus as well as for Denver Seminary, and she occasionally serves as the guest speaker at various women's spiritual retreats or classes for the local church. As much as teaching brings her joy, the most amazing gifts in her life are her husband and two young children.
