LED 501 Business Leadership and Management I (3)

Theories and realities of leadership and management processes in organizations with special emphasis on related biblical principles.

LED 502 Leadership and Management II (3)

Continuation of LED 501 with an emphasis on the use of financial information in enterprise management.

LED 510 Values-Aligned Leadership (3)

Ethical theories, issues, and dilemmas in the Information Age with particular emphasis upon the integration of the Bible and Christian principles into the making of ethical decisions.

ACC 501 Using Accounting Information (3)

Comprehensive overview of financial information focused on the use of financial reports in enterprise management.

MIT 501 Information Systems Management (3)

Basic knowledge of information systems including what information systems are, how they affect an organization and its employees, and how they can make businesses more efficient and competitive.

FIN 501 Financial Foundations (3)

Foundational concepts of business finance including the time-value of money, security pricing and valuations, portfolio risk and return, and derivative securities.

LAW 501 Legal Issues in Management (3)

Reviews concepts of basic business and employment law including governmental regulation of human resource matters, technology, and intellectual property rights; entity formation; taxation; estate planning; Uniform Commercial Code; the enforceability of electronic agreements; evidentiary problems; privacy; consumer rights; intellectual property as it relates to e-commerce; and trans-border issues.

MKT 510 Marketing Strategy (3)

Foundational principles of marketing with special attention given to the rapid changes occurring in the marketplace, technology's influence on communication and distribution, and global competition.

MBA 699 MBA Capstone Course (3)

Assimilates and synthesizes the material covered in the program following an integrated approach to management problem solving and decision making, and using all of the functional areas of business. The course will involve preparation of a business plan in a problem of the student's choosing.

As an alternative to the traditional MBA curriculum, which has leadership as its primary focus, students can choose to obtain emphases in one or more of the following areas:

CORPORATE TRAINING Develop best practices in group dynamics, human resource management, and mastering the teaching of adults and training for impact.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT Understand tactical and strategic implications for project selection, organization, planning process, communications, and negotiations.

INFORMATION SECURITY Gain the skills needed to ensure the enterprise's information security, including planning and analysis, auditing, risk management, disaster recovery, continuity management, and compliance. These courses are offered in conjunction with the University of Fairfax, the nation's premiere provider of information security graduate degree programs for adult professionals.
