The Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program is designed for nurses with a bachelor's degree in nursing who are ready to take on greater leadership roles in healthcare and education. Recent healthcare reforms and the ongoing shortage of nurse educators have increased the demand for nurses with master's degrees who can help fill the gap in meeting the needs of a growing patient population.

MSN students take a variety of core courses, including content in: ethics and advocacy; advanced pathophysiology, assessment, and pharmacology; leadership for the profession; health policy; and research. The two tracks offered build on this strong foundation, with courses grounded in biblical truth.
