SAVE TIME AND MONEY BY TRANSFERRING CREDITS

PRIOR LEARNING CREDIT

Save time and money by earning college credit for your life experience. There are two ways of doing so: credit by portfolio and credit by exam. Build a portfolio of your post-high school personal and professional learning experiences, or take advantage of low-cost CLEP, DSST, and UExcel testing options to test out of electives and many general education requirements.

Associate Degree: up to 45 credits

Bachelor's Degree: up to 75 credits

TRANSFER CREDIT FROM ANOTHER COLLEGE

If you started a degree at another regionally or nationally accredited college or university, you may be able to transfer credits toward your CCU degree. You can also earn credit through CCU's partnership with Straighterline.

Associate Degree: up to 45 credits

Bachelor's Degree: up to 90 credits

Accepted transfer credits vary by degree program. Check with your CCU enrollment counselor about transfer credit options for master's degree programs.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN ACCOUNTANCY

The Bachelor of Science in Accountancy degree is designed to meet the rising demand for accounting professionals who are committed to high ethical standards in the world of business. You will gain a foundation of knowledge in business and economics and receive training in a variety of specialized accounting fields, including tax accounting, accounting for nonprofit and government organizations, and accounting systems.

Focus areas in this program parallel sections of the Uniform CPA Examination, including financial accounting and reporting, auditing and attestation, and regulation. In addition, the coursework meets state exam requirements when combined with the Master of Science in Accounting or the Advanced Accounting emphasis for the MBA, as students will have completed the 150 credits in business and accounting required for CPA licensing.*

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN ACCOUNTING

The Master of Science in Accounting is designed for students who plan to pursue their Certified Public Accounting (CPA) credential, as students will have completed the 150 credits in business and accounting required for CPA licensing.* A Master of Science in Accounting is highly desirable in the accounting industry and will help differentiate yourself in a rapidly expanding field.

The Master of Science in Accounting is completely online, allowing you to complete your coursework from virtually anywhere in the world, as long as you have reliable access to the internet.

MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION — ADVANCED ACCOUNTING EMPHASIS

The Master of Business Administration programs at CCU focus on management and leadership. You will develop critical thinking, decision-making, and people management skills. You'll explore the concept of "servant leadership" and consider how to incorporate the eternal wisdom and love of Jesus Christ in the way you lead and manage others in the business environment.

Our MBA programs are ideal for adults who aspire toward senior management positions, such as CEO or COO positions, or want to be successful business owners or ministry leaders. The principles and skills you'll acquire will apply to you in both for-profit and nonprofit fields, as well as the military and law enforcement — virtually any organizational setting.

The MBA with an emphasis in Advanced Accounting is designed for students who plan to pursue their Certified Public Accounting (CPA) credential, as students will have completed the 150 credits in business and accounting required for CPA licensing.* Students must possess an undergraduate degree in Accounting (or equivalent) to take this emphasis.

CERTIFICATE IN ACCOUNTING

The Certificate in Accounting will help you gain a deeper understanding of accounting processes in business, management, and organizational operations. The curriculum emphasizes the development of values-based decision-making skills that make you a more valuable asset in the workforce. Course content for the Certificate in Accounting online program has practical applications in a variety of fields, from tax accounting to nonprofit and government accounting.

Topics of our Accounting classes include corporate financial accounting (including the accounting cycle), financial statements, budgeting, and tax accounting. You can customize your Certificate in Accounting by choosing two electives based on your needs and interests.

The Accounting Certificate is available as a stand-alone program, or you may transfer 12 credits from the certificate to a CCU bachelor's degree in Accountancy. Most of the certificate's coursework can be used toward a CCU bachelor's degree in Business, Information Systems Management, Organizational Management in Christian Leadership, Human Resource Management, or Project Management.
