CCUPrays PRAYER GUIDE May 7-9, 2020

Thank you very much for participating in CCUPrays. If you are feeling a bit daunted by the prospect of filling an entire half-hour with prayer, here are some suggestions for organizing your time.

We recommend dividing up the thirty minutes according to the following categories:

1. assigned requests

You can find our recommendations below for each half-hour during all three days.

2. other requests on the master list

Once you have prayed for the requests we recommend, feel free to scroll down the list and pray for any others to which you may be drawn.

3. group requests (specific to your prayer group)

Focus your next section of prayer time on requests specific to you and/or your prayer partners in this effort. For example, if you are sharing this prayer slot with some colleagues from work, you could pray for the peace of God for the rest of the folks on your work team.

4. individual requests (within your prayer group)

For the final portion of your prayer time slot you could text each member of your group, before or during your thirty minutes, for any last-minute requests specific to the group members.

Praying suggestions:

*Be as specific and detailed as you can be in your prayers.

For example, pray for each member of a specific group, not just the group as a whole. Project yourself into a person's situation (like a governor or mayor or town councilmember) and put some thought into what that person might really need, in terms of prayer support.

*Pray with a sense of humble confidence and expectation.

Pray with a sense of expectation that God will really answer your request, not because you're some kind of "super pray-er" but because God is gracious and has promised to answer the prayers of His children when they are according to His will.

*Pray according to God's Word. God has provided really good prayer advice already. You could even try praying the exact words of one of these verses or some other pertinent section of Scripture. Here are some examples of advice and subject matter: Psalm 6:9, 17:1, 66:18-20; Matthew 6:5-8; Romans 8:26; Ephesians 1:15-23, 6:18; Philippians 4:6-7; Colossians 4:2; 1 Tim. 2:1-3; 1 Peter 3:12.

*Consult the "Comments" portion of this webpage.

Those comments may provide encouragement for your effort and, perhaps, even document some answers to prayer requests you had on your list.
